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2011 NURSING DIVISION FEE SCHEDULE

Prices are effective July 1, 2011, and subject to change.

Childhood Immunizations (Ages 0-18 years):

All children vaccinated in our clinic must meet current Indiana State Department of Health eligibility guidelines. If they do not, they cannot be vaccinated here. Please refer to next page for eligibility requirements.

A \$5.00 **per child per visit** fee will be requested, regardless of the number of injections the child is to receive.

There will be no charge for patients on Medicaid.

**Flu vaccine may be given here to children who do not meet Indiana State Department of Health's eligibility guidelines. The vaccine given will be from our private purchased stock. Therefore, there will be a charge of \$15.00 per dose.

The below charges are per patient per visit.

Adult Immunizations:

Hepatitis B (20 yrs & over)	\$35.00/dose
Hepatitis A (19 years & older)	\$30.00/dose
Tdap (19 years & older - injury or update)	\$35.00/dose
Td (19 years & older - injury or update)	\$25.00/dose
Flu Vaccine (19 years & older)	\$15.00/dose

Tests:

PPD (TB Skin Test)	\$10.00/test
Quantiferon-TB	\$53.00/test

Screenings:

Hemoglobin	\$2.50/test
Lead Screening.....	No Charge
Blood Pressure.....	No Charge

The Indiana State Department of Health has recently issued new eligibility guidelines for the use of vaccine provided to us. Beginning July 1, 2011, the Hendricks County Health Department will no longer be able to provide immunizations to everyone, regardless of insurance status.

CHILDHOOD ELIGIBILITY:

We will still be able to provide vaccinations for the following children:

1. Uninsured
2. Medicaid
3. Native American or Alaskan
4. Insurance does not fully cover immunizations. "Insurance that does not fully cover immunizations" has been defined to us as private insurance coverage that does not include vaccines, covers only selected vaccines (in which case, the child would only be eligible for non-covered vaccines at our health department), or caps coverage at a certain amount (once that coverage amount is reached, then the child is eligible for state provided vaccine at our health department). "Insurance that does not fully cover immunizations" **does not include** those insurance plans that pay for vaccines after high deductibles, co-pays, or with 80/20 coverage, etc. These patients must go to their physician to be vaccinated.

To clarify, we are **no longer** able to provide childhood immunizations to the following with state provided vaccine:

- Patients who are fully insured with private insurance (insurance that pays for vaccines)
- Patients who are fully insured with private insurance, but **do not** have a physician
- Patients who are fully insured with private insurance and who have a physician, but the physician **does not** provide immunizations
- Patients who are over 18 years of age, unless needing school required vaccines and are still in high school (must meet adult eligibility)

ADULT ELIGIBILITY:

In addition to the changes in the childhood eligibility, there have been changes to the adult eligibility as well. We are no longer able to provide any state supplied vaccine to adults. The only vaccine we can give to adults is vaccine that we privately purchase, which we must charge for in order to cover our costs. Please see attached price sheet for vaccine that is available for adults through our health department.

As always, we provide immunizations by appointment only.
