




Births and Deaths 2012-2016






Immunizations Given Through Health Department 2012-2016

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















- The updated roster resulted in 45 solid MRC volunteers for the Health Department.


Completed CDC Core Capabilities 2012-2016

What is Accreditation?

Assuring healthy communities is the focus of public health. The Health Department is pursuing voluntary accreditation through the national Public Health Accreditation Board. Accreditation aligns services with nationally recognized standards, enhances the capacity of public health to deliver services that community needs and expects, and promotes a strong, efficient system to improve community health.



Health First Aid training, expanding the BABY & ME—Tobacco Free™ program, and partnering with the Hendricks County Solid Waste District on the Safe Sharps Disposal Program, among other activities

- Received about \$348,400.00 in grant funding to continue the BABY & ME—Tobacco Free™ program, establish the Hendricks County Immunization Advisory Council, provide training to staff and the community, implement community health improvement activities, and sustain three full-time and two part-time staff positions
- Received a grant for 50 naloxone rescue kits to facilitate drug death reduction activities outlined in the community health improvement plan
- Received \$7,995.00 in sponsorship funds for the Partnership to implement community health improvement activities

Domain 8

- Drafted the Health Department's workforce development plan
- Implemented a comprehensive performance evaluation and improvement system to include general employee performance evaluations, competency-based evaluations, work environment needs assessment, and individual development plans
- Two staff members received professional certifications as a Registered Environmental Health Specialist and a Certified Health Education Specialist
