Lewis H. Ballard Regulated Drain (494)

Mr. Gaston presented the Board with a Power-Point presentation showing the history of the drain, general condition, and current financial balance of the Ballard Regulated Drain. He then recommended vacating the Ballard Regulated Drain and that any funds in the account be transferred to the General Drain Improvement Fund per Indiana Code 36-9-27-37(d). Discussion followed. President Whetstone asked if there was anyone wishing to be heard on the Vacation of the Ballard Regulated Drain. Seeing none, he closed the public hearing. Discussion followed. Both gentlemen indicated if the Highway Department was going to take care of the issue, they were ok with the vacation of the drain. President Whetstone asked if anyone else wished to be heard. Discussion followed. Member Bob Gentry moved to follow the Surveyor's recommendation. Member Stan Ryland seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Mr. Gaston stated he had received 4 estimates for the Holloway Regulated Drain project they were as follows:

President Whetstone recognized Mr. Jim Jones. Mr. Jones said he was very concerned with a new development going in near Sycamore Estates where he lives. Mr. Gaston stated he had met with Mr. Jones on two occasions, but until the new development has submitted plans for the area, he cannot determine whether they will increase or decrease the problems in Sycamore Estates. President Whetstone let Mr. Jones know the Board, through Mr. Gaston, would keep an eye on the issue.

President Whetstone asked Mr. Gaston to coordinate having the Highway, Clean Water, and Health Department send inspectors out to the property to investigate the situation.
