<u>RE: HENDRICKS COUNTY SURVEYOR DAVID GASTON:</u>

Gilbert Woods Regulated Drain

Hendricks County Surveyor David Gaston stated the Town of Clayton is requesting help with paying for the weed control program for the pond on the Gilbert Woods Regulated Drain. Mr. Gaston said the Town has been paying to have the pond's weeds sprayed several times a year and they would like the Board to share in the cost of what the Town of Clayton has already paid for 2017 and 2018. Also, the Town is requesting the Board help pay for the 2019 spray program. David Gaston presented the Board with an email from Mr. Don Slattery that showed the Town of Clayton paid \$1096.00 and \$966.00 in 2017. This document also contained the estimate for 2019 of \$992.00. Discussion followed. President Palmer recognized Mr. Don Slattery of the Town of Clayton. Mr. Slattery informed the Board that the Town had been keeping the pond's weeds under control by having it sprayed several times a year and had been doing so since 2017. The Town would like the Board to share in the cost of this program at whatever level they determined was fair. Discussion followed. Vice President Whetstone moved to pay half the cost for the weed control program for years 2017 through 2019. Member Bob Gentry seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Martin Dugan Regulated Drain

Mr. Gaston informed the Board that his office had received three quotes for the Martin Dugan Regulated Drain project. The quotes were as follows:

Taylor Cooper Excavating	\$10,270.00

Mr. Gaston recommended Beechwood Construction as they had the lowest responsible quote for the project. Discussion followed. Vice President Whetstone moved to follow the Surveyor's recommendation. Member Bob Gentry seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Plainfield Regulated Drains

Mr. Gaston informed the Board that the transfer of the regulated drains within the corporate limits of the Town of Plainfield would be complete as of February 27th, 2019 when the funds for those drains would be sent to the Town.

Joint Drainage Board Meeting

Mr. Gaston informed the Board that the South Gate project had been received by his office and the Morgan County Surveyor's Office and he had sent the project to Christopher Burke for review and once that was complete, the Joint Board would meet to discuss and vote on the project. Discussion followed. Mr. Gaston asked the Board if they would like to temporarily appoint a member to the Joint Board in the absence of Member Stan Ryland. Discussion followed. Member Jack Maloney volunteered to fill in for Member Stan Ryland. Member Bob Gentry moved to temporarily appoint member Jack Maloney to the Joint Board in Member Stan Ryland's absence. Vice President Whetstone seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Re-Assessments – Joe Miller

Mr. Joe Miller, representing Banning Engineering, presented the Board with the Surveyor's Reports and re-assessment break down for the Michael Martin Dugan, Richard Plummer, Glen Arnold, John Lackey, Gilbert Woods, Hidden Valley and Springtown Heights Regulated Drains. Discussion followed. Vice President Whetstone moved to accept the Surveyor's Reports for the previously mentioned regulated drains. Member Bob Gentry seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed. The Board asked Mr. Gaston and Mr. Miller to plan dates for the informational meetings and hearings and come back to them with a recommendation.

William Batz Arm 2

Mr. Gaston informed the Board that they had received two sealed bids for the William Batz Arm 2 project. President Palmer asked for the bids to be opened. The bids were as follows:

<u>RE: INTRODUCTION OF OTHER BUSINESS OR ADDITIONAL DISCUSSION BY</u> <u>COMMISSION MEMBERS:</u>

Holloway Regulated Drain

President Palmer recognized Member Jack Maloney. Mr. Maloney stated he had driven by the Holloway Regulated Drain and was concerned that it was still so full. Inspector Tiffany Dalton said Pulte Homes had pulled out all of the pumps and were no longer sending excess water into the drain. In addition, she had informed them that if they needed to pump out any more water, they would need to use tanker trucks to haul it away.

Jack Maloney Concern on 925 East

Mr. Maloney said he had been approached by home owners in what Mr. Maloney referred to as "Schrier Estates" for help in removing excess drainage water from their properties on the east side of CR 925 E, across the road from him. Mr. Maloney said they would like to move the water under the road and across to his property then into the Kate Lee Regulated Drain. He was concerned with this plan because the Kate Lee, in its current condition, could not handle the extra water. Discussion followed. Mr. Gaston said he would meet with Hendricks County Engineer John Ayers to discuss the situation and come up with a recommendation. Mr. Ayers then stated that the Engineering Department was not suggesting any solution yet but had asked Mr. Maloney for some historical perspective and his thoughts and assistance with possible solutions.

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Seeing nothing further before the Board, Vice President Whetstone moved to adjourn the meeting. Member Bob Gentry seconded the motion. The motion was passed unanimously.
