# HENDRICKS COUNTY COUNCIL MARCH 05, 2019

The regular meeting of the Hendricks County Council was called to order by President Eric Wathen on Tuesday March 5, 2019 with the following in attendance: Caleb Brown, David Cox, Larry Hesson, Larry Scott, Eric Wathen, David Wyeth and Financial Administrator Tami Mitchell. President Eric Wathen led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **IN THE MATTER OF THE MINUTES**

It was moved by Larry Scott and seconded by David Cox to adopt the minutes of the February 5, 2019 meeting as presented. Motion carried 5-0-1 (LH).

### IN THE MATTER OF PROBATION DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEE NEEDS

Susan Bentley, Probation Director presented a Probation Workload Analysis which reflected a request for three additional probation officers to meet state standards. Discussion was held on the probation contact standards and the high risk, medium risk and low risk requirements. Ms. Bentley stated the Commissioners were considering renting space for the CASA employees to make space for possible new probation officers. Ms. Bentley stated that the probation officers conduct their own urinalysis testing which takes considerable time. Ms. Bentley was asked to come back to the April Council meeting with additional information to try to pinpoint the reason for the large jump in clients between 2017 and 2018. It was moved by Larry Hesson and seconded by David Cox to table until the April meeting. Motion carried 6-0.

## IN THE MATTER OF THE REVISED 70/39 COMMERCE PARK FINANCE PLAN

Hendricks County Bond Attorney, Bruce Donaldson, Barnes & Thornburg, gave a brief history of the 70/39 Commerce Park TIF located at the southwest corner of I70 and SR 39. Mr. Donaldson stated that the project was originally a Scannell & Kite Project where the developer proposed purchasing the bond but the bond never closed. Mr. Donaldson stated that at the end of 2018, Mr. Terry McCardwell of MCC Properties #100 LLC bought the property and has a similar proposal for the Council to consider.

Developer, Terry McCardwell stated that he purchased 215 acres and is planning on building 3,000,000 square feet of building space. Mr. McCardwell stated that a 600,000 square foot building is in the planning stages and he hoped to be approved by the end of March. Mr. McCardwell stated he feels confident that one building will be going up this spring.

Financial Consultant, Greg Guerrettaz, Financial Solutions Group, Inc. stated this project is following the 50% pass through policy of the Commissioners for this area which will help the units of government. Mr. Guerrettaz stated this falls under the "but for" clause that but for this project, it isn't going to happen.

It was moved by Larry Hesson and seconded by David Cox to approve Ordinance 2019-05 An Ordinance of the Hendricks County Council Authorizing the Issuance of the Hendricks County Indiana Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2019 (Hendricks Gateway Park Project), and the Provision of the Proceeds Thereof to MCC Properties #100, LLC, or an Affiliate Thereof, Authorizing Expenditures of County Edit Funds on the Project, Approving a Reimbursement Agreement with the County Redevelopment Commission, and Authorizing and Approving Other Actions in Respect Thereto. Motion carried 6-0.

### IN THE MATTER OF ADDITIONALS

Hendricks County Health Officer Dr. David Stopperich introduced the new Environmental Health Director, Krista Click. Since emergency additional appropriations for Local Health Maintenance and Local Health Maintenance were from funds other that property tax, upon made by David Wyeth and seconded by Caleb Brown, appropriations number 1 through 21 were approved as presented. Motion carried 6-0.

It was moved by David Cox and seconded by David Wyeth to approve emergency additional appropriation number 22 as presented. Motion carried 6-0.

Whereas, certain extraordinary emergencies have developed since the adoption of the existing budget, so that it is necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget; therefore, to meet such extraordinary emergencies;

Be it resolved by the County Council of Hendricks County, Indiana, that for the expense of said County the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart out of the several funds as herein and for the purpose herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same.
