HENDRICKS COUNTY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING APRIL 16, 2024

The regular meeting of the Hendricks County Council was called to order by President Eric Wathen on Tuesday April 16, 2024 with the following in attendance: Councilmen Caleb Brown, David Cox, Larry Scott, Eric Wathen, Brad Whicker, David Wyeth, Deputy Auditor Cinda Kattau, Financial Administrator Paula Alkire and Legal Counsel Rhonda Cook. Councilman Larry Hesson and Auditor Nancy Marsh were not in attendance. Councilman David Cox led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

IN THE MATTER OF THE MARCH 19, 2024 COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

It was moved by Brad Whicker and seconded by Larry Scott to approve the minutes of the March 19, 2024 meeting as presented. Motion carried 6-0.

IN THE MATTER OF PUBLIC COMMENT

Peggy McRoy introduced herself and stated, going forward, she would be reporting for the local publication Hendricks County Community CONNECT. Her intention is to inform the taxpayers of the good things the County Council is doing.

IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION FOR REAL PROPERTY ABATEMENT FROM SCP MONROVIA, LLC. AND CONFIRMING RESOLUTION 2024-13

Joe Jasin, Project Manager, of the Hendricks County Economic Development Partnership presented Resolution Setting Forth Final Action in Determining That the Qualifications for an Economic Revitalization have been met and Confirming Resolution 2024-11 of March 19, 2024.

Legal Counsel Rhonda Cook stated the legal notice to the underlying units went out the day before. President Wathen opened the public hearing. With no comments, the hearing was closed. It was moved by Caleb Brown and seconded by David Cox to approve the *Resolution Setting Forth Final Action in Determining That the Qualifications for an Economic Revitalization have been met and Confirming Resolution 2024-11 of March 19, 2024.* Motion carried 6-0.

IN THE MATTER OF SHERIFF'S DEPUTY FRED FISLAR

President Wathen announced the tragic, in the line of duty, death of Hendricks County Merit Deputy Fred Fislar and requested a moment of silence.

IN THE MATTER OF THE INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

Hendricks County Engineer, John Ayers, presented an *Interlocal Cooperation Agreement* between The Town of Mooresville, Indiana and Hendricks County, Indiana. Mr. Ayers stated the agreement had been signed by the Hendricks County Commissioners on April 9th and was ready to be signed by the Hendricks County Council. It was moved by David Cox and

seconded by Larry Scott to approve the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement as recommended by the County Commissioners. Motion carried 6-0.

IN THE MATTER OF THE EMERGENCY ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS

President Eric Wathen opened the Public Hearing for Emergency Additional Appropriations. Hearing no comments from the public, the Public Hearing was closed. It was moved by Brad Whicker and seconded by Caleb Brown to approve Emergency Appropriation Resolution items one through six as presented. Motion carried 6-0.

IN THE MATTER OF THE STATUS OF FUNDS

President Wathen acknowledged the Status of Funds Report had been distributed to Council members.

Hendricks County Commissioner Dennis Dawes provided an update on the Highway Garage Project. The project is moving ahead and will be presented at the next Council Meeting.

County Engineer John Ayres expounded upon the Highway Garage Project explaining the modifications to the design.

Mr. Ayers commented on the status of Bridge 290 Dan Jones over CSX. He will be requesting an additional appropriation for the May Council meeting, mainly from the Major Bridge Fund. The project should begin late May. The engineer's estimate came in at about \$16.5 million.

Engineer Ayres also informed the County Council that the Community Crossings Grant came through at one and a half million dollars (1,500,000) to be used for road repairs. With a County Match of \$1.5 million, added to the \$6.3 million dollars previously appropriated in the Motor Vehicle Highway, Wheel Tax, and Food & Beverage Tax, the entire amount would be \$9.3 million dollars. President Wathen requested that the Auditor add the topic to the May County Council Agenda and to advertise an additional appropriation of \$1.5 million from Food & Beverage.

Highway Supervisor Curt Higginbotham discussed the road resurfacing answering; questions about the cost per mile.

Legal Counsel Rhonda Cook informed the County Council that she would like to come up with a checklist for the abatement approvals for Hendricks County going through Hendricks County Economic Development Partnership.

Councilman David Wyeth brought up the ongoing celebration of the County's Bicentennial. Larry Scott urged all to go to the Bicentennial website, <u>Hendricks200.com</u>, for upcoming events. Mr. Scott said a book is to be published this summer containing a chapter for each township.

Councilman Cox provided an update on Youth Assistance Program (YAP). Avon Community Schools is close to coming on. Northwest Hendricks Community Schools has joined the efforts.

Councilman Cox distributed an email from First Due Company regarding the County highway garage project.

There being no further business to come before the Council, upon motion made by David Wyeth and seconded by Caleb Brown, the meeting was adjourned at 9:25 a.m., Tuesday, April 16, 2024.
