The Hendricks County Board of Commissioners met in regular session at 9:30 AM on Tuesday, April 22, 2008 with a quorum of three (3) Commissioners in the Commissioners' Meeting Room on the first floor of the Hendricks County Government Center with the following in attendance:

Commissioner Whicker opened the meeting and led the Pledge to the Flag in unison.

#### IN THE MATTER OF MINUTES

Commissioner Wathen moved to approve the minutes of April 15, 2008, as corrected. Commissioner Palmer seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously 3-0-0.

#### IN THE MATTER OF CLAIMS

Commissioner Palmer moved to approve claims #181265 thru 181284 and #181292 thru 181302 as advertised.

Commissioner Wathen seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously 3-0-0.

#### IN THE MATTER OF EXIT 59

Commissioner Whicker referenced a phone message from Tag Birge, Lauth Development, advising that Lauth is moving along on their project at Exit 59.

Greg Steuerwald stated Tag Birge has contacted Bruce Donaldson, Barnes & Thornburg, relative to the TIF bonds. It is the Commissioners understanding they are still waiting for Lauth to offer a proposal for the Commissioners to consider.

Greg Steuerwald stated Bruce Donaldson, Barnes & Thornburg, recommends we consider a Letter of Intent instead of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the Exit 59 Kite project. The Commissioners concurred with this recommendation.

#### IN THE MATTER OF RONALD REAGAN PARKWAY

Commissioner Wathen announced the May 9, 2008 meeting with INDOT to discuss the Ronald Reagan Parkway and SR 267 exchange. John Ayers stated Appian had forwarded him the costs from INDOT for the proposed swap. Commissioner Wathen also stated the Ronald Reagan Task Force will meet again on May 14, 2008 to discuss funding.

John Ayers stated they are looking at the \$500,000 earmark from Congressman Buyer and he will be bringing a list of proposals for use of these funds.

John Ayers advised the repaving of the Ronald Reagan Parkway from US 36 to CR 100N is on the Highway list to do this summer and he is working with the Town of Avon on the portion of the Parkway that is within the Town of Avon.

#### IN THE MATTER OF JUDICIAL CENTER

John Ayers stated he and the architects had met with office holders at the Courthouse and now have their input for a proposed judicial center. He also stated this will be discussed in the joint Commissioner and Council workshop scheduled for Thursday, May 8, 2008 at 3:30 PM in the Government Center.

There was discussion of funding for this judicial center study. Mike Graham stated there are currently funds in the Commissioners' Special Projects line that would cover the \$25,000 study. Commissioner Wathen moved to use the Special Projects line to fund the judicial center study and that these \$25,000 funds be repaid if a bond issue is approved and issued for the judicial center at a later date. Commissioner Palmer seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously 3-0-0.

# IN THE MATTER OF ORDINANCE NO. 2008-02 ZA 305/08: THE VILLAGE OF HERITAGE HILL

Don Reitz presented an ordinance amendment to an approved plan of the zoning map of Hendricks County for a PUD/Planned Unit Development, commonly known as ZA 305/08 (PUD 29) the Village of Heritage Hill, for an amendment to zoning commitments for 242 acres, located approximately 0.11 mile north of the intersection of CR 200N and SR 267, internal to the Village of Heritage Hills Planned Unit Development. Mr. Reitz explained this request is to keep commitment #7 for Phase II construction of Northfield Drive includes constructing the remaining length of the roadway to CR 600E, which construction shall commence not later than 5 years from completion and acceptance of Phase 1 and said Phase II shall be completed within 1 year. This amendment is to eliminate the Commitment Number 8, which states, "At the point 210 apartment units are constructed within Legacy Park, Phase II construction of Northfield Drive will need to occur." He further stated the Plan Commission held a public hearing on April 8, 2008 and sends this amendment with a favorable recommendation of 6-0-0. Commissioner Wathen moved to approve the amendment to the Village of Heritage Hills to eliminate Commitment Number 8, which states "At the point 210 apartment units are constructed within Legacy Park, Phase II construction of Northfield Drive will need to occur:", as Ordinance 2008-02. Commissioner Palmer seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously 3-0-0.

### IN THE MATTER OF ZONING

Don Reitz presented a draft zoning map that was produced from an electronic zoning map and gave a brief update

on the Zoning Department replacing the County's working zoning maps with these new electronic maps

Don Ritz announced the Tuesday, May 13, 2008 meeting in the Government Center for the Hendricks County Plan Commission to consider the proposed Hendricks County Zoning Ordinance Update.

Don Reitz stated they are continuing to work towards an electronic permitting system for Hendricks County.

IN THE MATTER OF ANIMAL CONTROL

Mike Graham reported Mary Ann Lewis, Chief Animal Control Officer, is requesting the Commissioners to amend the impoundment fee schedule for any impounded livestock, horses, wild animals or large exotic animals as there have recently been a large number of horses and goats that Animal Control needed to impound. Mr. Graham stated the costs associated with boarding and feeding these animals is significant and Ms. Lewis is requesting to increase the fees charged to the owner of these impounded animals by increasing the impound fee, maintenance, hauling charge and require owners to pay for all veterinarian costs. It was the consensus of the Commissioners for Mike Graham and Mary Ann Lewis to draft an amendment reimbursement for Animal Control and bring back for further consideration.

#### IN THE MATTER OF SENIOR COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAM

Mike Graham reported Goodwill Industries of Central Indiana administers a federal program authorized under the Older Americans Act that has three purposes: to foster and promote useful part-time opportunities in community service activities for unemployed low-income persons who are 55 years of age or older and who have poor employment prospects; to foster individual economic self-sufficiency; and to increase the number of older persons who may enjoy benefits of unsubsidized employment in both the public and private sectors. Mr. Graham explained the program places older people (55 years and older) in part time jobs (up to 20 hours) in government and not for profit organizations and stated that Goodwill would like to work with Hendricks County to place people in positions in County Government and to network within the County to find other organizations who may participate in the program. He stated the Goodwill staff could make a presentation at a future Commissioners meeting. It was the consensus of the Commissioners to invite a presentation from Goodwill and to extend the invitation to Senior Services and Human Resources.

#### IN THE MATTER OF SEARCH & RESCUE GROUP

Mike Graham advised he has arranged a meeting with the volunteer search and rescue group to meet with the Fire Chiefs at their May 1, 2008 meeting and stated his volunteer group wanted to hold off meeting with the Police Chiefs until after they meet with the Fire Chiefs.

#### IN THE MATTER OF LINK GRANTS

Mike Graham advised of a meeting he attended with Auditor Cinda Kattau, Treasurer Nancy Marsh, Sycamore Services Director Pat Cochran, Sycamore Services CFO Dan Martin, the Sycamore Services staff, State Board of Accounts Auditor Eugene West and INDOT representative James English. Mr. Graham stated they have resolved the issue with the State Board of Accounts regarding the LINK grants. Mr. Graham explained the State Board of Accounts found that the County was not monitoring the LINK grants as is required by federal accounting guidelines and presented the State Board of Accounts' findings regarding the deficiencies in the County's monitoring of the Sycamore Services and Senior Services transportation grant with INDOT. He also presented the corrective action

#### IN THE MATTER OF WAGE COMMITTEE

Mike Graham advised we have been contacted regarding the wages approved by the Wage Committee for nine County projects at their May 14, 2008 meeting.

#### IN THE MATTER OF BLUE HOUSE

John Ayers stated they are obtaining a legal description for the blue house that was purchased by the County that is located in the County right-of-way for Bridge No. 274 near Cartersburg Road. They will prepare a legal ad for the sale of this property that will include the clause "the County has the right to refuse any and all bids".

#### IN THE MATTER OF 56<sup>TH</sup> STREET

John Ayers explained he has received no response from representatives from the Town of Brownsburg relative to 56<sup>th</sup> Street. He also stated he is working with Greg Guerrettaz, Financial Solutions Group, for funding.

John Ayers stated they are working to obtain right-of-way along 56<sup>th</sup> Street.

#### IN THE MATTER OF PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE

John Ayers advised he had contacted the Prosecutor relative to the phone installation and expenses required for the Prosecutor's new space on South Jefferson and was informed the Prosecutor will fund the phones and installation from her budget.

#### IN THE MATTER OF WORK RELEASE

John Ayers stated the Hendricks County Judges would like to invite the Indiana Chief Justice to the dedication of the new work release facility, however, the only dates the Chief Justice has open are August 15 and August 22, 2008 and stated the work release should be up and running by those dates. It was the consensus of the Commissioners to set the dedication date for the new work release facility in August in order for the Chief Justice to attend, as requested by the Judges.

John Ayers expressed concerns for the sealing of the cement floors in the work release facility and stated the offices are carpeted, however, the concrete hallway and public areas are not satisfactory. Mr. Ayers presented a change order from Brandt with a quote to epoxy the floors in the corridors and restrooms for \$13,660.63 and the day rooms and security for \$15,137.10. He stated this would improve the appearance and would also be better for care and cleanliness. Commissioner Whicker moved to approve the change order with Brandt to epoxy the concrete floors in the corridor and restrooms for \$13,660.63 and the dayrooms and security for \$15,137.10 in the work release facility, as recommended by the County Engineer. Commissioner Palmer seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously 3-0-0.

## IN THE MATTER OF ORDINANCE NUMBER 2008-03 ORDINANCE FOR MAXIMUM SPEED LIMITS ON CERTAIN COUNTY ROADS

John Ayers presented the Ordinance for maximum speed limits on certain County roads for CR 700W from SR 75 to CR 450S to lower the speed limit to 40mph. Commissioner Whicker opened the public hearing for this ordinance at 10:28 AM. Mr. Ayers presented a map showing the section of CR 700W that would be affected by this speed limit ordinance. There was no public input. Commissioner Whicker closed the public hearing at 10:30 AM. Commissioner Palmer moved to adopt Ordinance No. 2008-03 to establish a reduced speed limit for a portion of CR 700W, as presented. Commissioner Wathen seconded the motion and stated he did not feel this speed limit would

#### IN THE MATTER OF LANDSCAPING

Receipt was acknowledged of a request from Elvin Cassity, Custodial Superintendent, to purchase mulch for the Government Center and Courthouse lawns as has been done in previous years for around \$1,550. There was discussion of keeping the landscaped areas weeded. Commissioner Wathen moved to approve the hiring of mulching of the landscaped areas of the Courthouse and Government Center, contingent on keeping the areas weeded.

Commissioner Palmer seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously 3-0-0.

#### IN THE MATTER OF HARDIN FARMS

Receipt was acknowledged of a letter from Hardin Farms informing the Commissioners their farm is renewing its Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation (CAFO) permit with the state of Indiana for their farm located at 4881 W CR 200N, Danville, IN. They also advised the state Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) has a new rule that requires them to notify adjoining land owners and the County Commissioners whenever renewal occurs. Commissioner Whicker stated the Hardins have and will continue to be good neighbors and good stewards of the land.

#### IN THE MATTER OF RELAY FOR LIFE 2008

Receipt was acknowledged of a request from Megan Murmacz, Chairman of the Avon Relay for Life, requesting a proclamation for the four Hendricks County Relay for Life sites in Avon on May 17 - 18, Brownsburg on June 7 - 8, Danville on June 14 -15 and Plainfield June 28 and 29.
