BUS SAFETY

Indiana law states that any person driving on a highway who approaches a stopped school bus with the arm signal extended from any direction must stop prior to reaching the bus and may not proceed past the bus until the arm is no longer extended. If a violation occurs, it is presumed that the owner of the vehicle has committed the violation and therefore it is not necessary to be caught at the scene.

If the highway is divided into 2 or more roadways by leaving a space unintended for vehicular travel, a physical barrier, or a dividing section constructed to impeded traffic, and if the bus is on the opposite side, a driver is not required to stop unless otherwise posted.
