DPR 513 (IMI Concrete Plant) - County

2 lots on 33.59 acres in Liberty Township, S34-T14N-R1W, located on the southside of Interstate 70 and the northside of East Hendricks County Road, approximately 6,669 feet west of State Road 39. This project is at the NW corner of County Line Road (Morgan County) and County Road 100 East. (Crossroads Engineers) No Regulated Drain.

Hendricks County Surveyor David Gaston recommended the Hendricks County Drainage Board grant Final Approval of *S-11-08 (NWHSC – Soccer Fields "Tri-West")* subject to the conditions of the Hendricks County Surveyor's letter, all the requirements and conditions of the Hendricks County Stormwater Management Handbook, and a \$100.00 per acre assessment payable to the Lorin Ross Regulated Drain. Discussion followed. Member Jack Maloney moved to follow the Surveyor's recommendation. Member Dennis Dawes seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

MIP 1166 (Rutledge) – County

2 lots on 13 acres in Clay Township, S5&6-T14N-R2W, located on the westside of Masten Road approximately 200 feet northwest of the intersection of Masten Road and State Road 75 (Kruse Consulting) *No Regulated Drain*.

Hendricks County Surveyor David Gaston recommended the Hendricks County Drainage Board grant Final Approval of *MIP 1166 (Rutledge)* subject to the conditions of the Hendricks County Surveyor's letter, and all the requirements and conditions of the Hendricks County Stormwater Management Handbook. Discussion followed. Member Jack Maloney moved to follow the Surveyor's recommendation. Member Dennis Dawes seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

RE: HENDRICKS COUNTY SURVEYOR DAVID GASTON:

Stanley Cove Regulated Drain

Hendricks County Surveyor David Gaston stated an emergent situation was taking place with the Stanley Cove Regulated Drain Dam. Hendricks County Inspector Dirk Leonard explained that a temporary dam had been placed on the lake to protect the spillway from further damage. He stated he had sent out a request for emergency sealed quotes for the needed work and the Surveyor's Office had received two (2). He went on to say that he, Hendricks County Engineer John Ayers, and Hendricks County Highway Superintendent Curt Higginbotham had discovered that the plan to fix the dam may cause harsh erosion at the outlet's release point which will require rock armor protection to stop the erosion. So, a change order for additional work/funds will be needed to complete the project. Discussion followed. President Gentry requested the sealed quotes be opened. The quotes were as follows:

Alexander Contractors

\$109,275.34

Murrain Excavating

\$114,250.00

After reviewing the quotes Inspector Dirk Leonard recommended Alexander Contractors as they had the lowest responsible quote at \$109,275.34. Discussion followed. Member Jack Maloney moved to approve the recommendation with the understanding that a change order would be coming in for the additional work. Member Dennis Dawes seconded the motion and stated that he recommended filling out an ARPA application for the project as he believed there were additional funds available. The motion was unanimously approved.

Conrad McVey Regulated Drain

President Gentry Stated he had been called out to look at a drainage problem with the sidewalk installed for the Dollar General in New Winchester. He said the sidewalk was holding back water and causing the area to back up. In addition, where the water tops the sidewalk, it was causing an extremely strong current which could cause bodily harm to pedestrians. Discussion followed. Mr. Gaston stated that he had been informed of the situation and planned to contact INDOT as the sidewalk was within their road right-of-way. He said he would also be contacting Dollar General to get the situation rectified as soon as possible. It was the consensus of the Board to proceed with Mr. Gaston's plan with all do haste.
