RE: HENDRICKS COUNTY SURVEYOR DAVID GASTON:

Suspension of Assessment Recommendation

Hendricks County Surveyor David Gaston presented the Board with his recommendation for the regulated drain assessment suspensions for the 2019 tax year. Discussion followed. Member Bob Gentry moved to accept the Surveyor's recommendation as presented. Vice President Phyllis Palmer and Member Stan Ryland seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Resolution 2018-21

Mr. Gaston presented the Board with Resolution 2018-21 which transfers all regulated drains within the corporate limits of the Town of Plainfield to the Town along with all funds in their drain accounts minus any money owed to the General Drain Improvement Fund after settlement of Fall collections. Discussion followed. Vice President Phyllis Palmer moved to approve the Resolution as presented. Member Bob Gentry seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Rolling Hills Regulated Drain – Sealed Quotes

Mr. Gaston stated his office had received two sealed quotes for the Rolling Hills Regulated Drain project. President Whetstone asked that they be opened. The quotes were as follows:

Murrain Excavating	\$27,371.00
Stephenson Excavating	\$28,667.00

After reviewing the quotes, Inspector Dalton recommended Murrain Excavating as the lowest responsible quote. Discussion followed. Member Bob Gentry moved to follow the recommendation. Member Jack Maloney seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Batz Regulated Drain

Mr. Gaston said the Batz Regulated Drain project was moving forward as projected.

Quinn Regulated Drain

The I-74 project would not be on INDOT's pay schedule until 2022. If the Drainage Board approved doing and paying for the work now, INDOT would reimburse the Drainage Board for their portion much sooner. Discussion followed. Member Bob Gentry moved to approve and pay for the work now and bill INDOT for their portion after the work is completed. Member Jack Maloney seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Barnett Regulated Drain

Mr. Gaston stated he had received a request from Mr. Kent Dunbar to reduce his portion of the Barnett Regulated Drain project bill from Murrain Excavating. He then introduced Mr. Dunbar. Mr. Dunbar asked that his bill be reduced by the amount of help he provided to the project. He stated Mr. Murrain estimated his assistance at \$1,850.00. Discussion followed. Member Jack Maloney moved to reduce Mr. Dunbar's bill to \$5,500.00. Member Bob Gentry seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

McVey Regulated Drain

Mr. Gaston said while working on the McVey Regulated Drain project, INDOT had found two tiles running along and under State Road 75. He requested they replace both tiles. They'll find out where the second tile leads at a later date. Member Bob Gentry asked that they speak with Allen Hardin as he may have some information about the second tile.

Barnett Regulated Drain

Mr. Gaston stated there had been some slumping going on along the banks of the Barnett Regulated Drain and there may be a need to do some additional work in that area.

<u>RE: IN THE MATTER OF WISHES TO BE HEARD:</u>

Elmore Regulated Drain – Martin Dial

President Whetstone recognized Mr. Martin Dial. Mr. Dial said the Elmore Regulated Drain that runs behind his property is not functioning properly and his property is staying wet for long periods of time. Discussion followed. Mr. Gaston said the Elmore Drain is a non-certified regulated drain and is failing. He stated it was on the list for reconstruction/re-assessment and the Board was waiting for the report from Banning Engineering. Discussion followed. President Whetstone explained to Mr. Dial that since the drain was not certified, there was no money to fix it at this time. Once the Board receives the report from Banning Engineering, a hearing would be held to decide whether to reconstruct the drain or vacate it. Discussion followed.

<u>RE: INTRODUCTION OF OTHER BUSINESS OR ADDITIONAL DISCUSSION BY</u>

Ross Regulated Drain

Member Bob Gentry asked for an update on the Ross Regulated Drain near Boone County Line. Inspector Tiffany Dalton said she had walked the entire drain and found no obstructions that were holding back water except the bridge/culvert on the Boone County side. Discussion followed.

Seeing nothing further before the Board, Vice President Palmer moved to adjourn the meeting. Member Bob Gentry seconded the motion. The motion was passed unanimously.
