HENDRICKS COUNTY COUNCIL February 05, 2019

The regular meeting of the Hendricks County Council was called to order by President Eric Wathen on Tuesday February 5, 2019 with the following in attendance: Caleb Brown, David Cox, Larry Scott, Eric Wathen, David Wyeth, Brad Whicker and Financial Administrator Tami Mitchell. President Eric Wathen led the Pledge of Allegiance.

IN THE MATTER OF THE MINUTES

It was moved by Larry Scott and seconded by David Cox to adopt the minutes as presented. Motion carried 5-0-1, with Brad Whicker abstaining.

IN THE MATTER OF RESCINDING ORDINANCE 2019-02A

It was moved by Brad Whicker and seconded by David Wyeth to rescind Ordinance 2019-02A. Motion carried 6-0.

IN THE MATTER OF RECOMMENDATIONS TO AVON AND DANVILLE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSIONS

It was moved by David Cox and seconded by Caleb Brown to approve the appointment of Jessica Hynson to the Avon Economic Development Commission. Motion passed 6-0. It was moved by David Wyeth and seconded by Brad Whicker to appointment Greg VanLaere to the Danville Economic Development Commission. Motion passed 6-0.

IN THE MATTER OF AN UPDATE ON FIRST PERSON BENEFITS

Todd McCormack, Executive Director, reported to the Council of the departure of Compensation Advisor, Julie Bingham, assigned to work with Hendricks County. Bryan Brenner, CEO and Katy Stowers, Executive VP, were present for First Person. Ms. Stowers stated Melinda Dean would be the new Compensation Advisor. Mr. McCormack said the work could still be completed by budget time. It was the consensus of the Council to continue with First Person.

IN THE MATTER OF SHERIFF EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT RENEWAL

Sheriff Brett Clark provided Council with a Compensation Agreement between Brett A. Clark and the County of Hendricks. It was moved by Brad Whicker and seconded by Larry Scott to approve the agreement. Motion carried 6-0.

IN THE MATTER OF MATRON PAY

Sheriff Clark explained that according to statute the Jail Matron's salary should be the same as a Merit Deputy based on years of service. He asked that the Jail Matron be paid according to the Sheriff Deputy Matrix approved for the 2019 budget. It was moved by Caleb Brown

and seconded by David Wyeth to approve the increase in accordance with the matrix retroactive to the first pay in 2019. Motion passed 6-0.

Sheriff Clark reported he was making most of the visits for the Virtual Indiana School program. He stated payments totaling around \$5,500 had been received so far and was being used to help fund the Sheriff's pension plan.

IN THE MATTER OF PARKS AND RECREATION

It was moved by Brad Whicker and seconded by Larry Scott to provide a letter of support for the Next Level Trails Grant application. If awarded the funds would be used for purchase of land between Clayton and Amo for the Vandalia Trail. Motion passed 5-0-1, with David Wyeth abstaining.

IN THE MATTER OF THE B & O TRAIL

Dave Jackson, B & O Trail Association, requested a for a letter of support for the Next Level Trails grant. It was moved by Brad Whicker and seconded by David Cox for President Wathen to sign a letter of support on behalf of the Council. Motion passed 6-0.

IN THE MATTER OF HUMAN RESOURCES

Erin Hughes, Human Resources Administrator, introduced the new Human Resources Assistant, Mandy Dostin.









ORDINANCE NO. 2019 - 05

AN ORDINANCE OF THE HENDRICKS COUNTY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF THE HENDRICKS DEVELOPMENT COUNTY, **INDIANA ECONOMIC** REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2019 (HENDRICKS GATEWAY **PROVISION** PARK PROJECT), AND THE PROCEEDS THEREOF TO MCC PROPERTIES #100, LLC, OR AN AFFILIATE THEREOF, AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES OF COUNTY EDIT FUNDS ON THE PROJECT, APPROVING A REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT WITH THE COUNTY REDEVELOPMENT COMMISSION, AND AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING OTHER ACTIONS IN RESPECT THERETO

WHEREAS, Hendricks County, Indiana (the "County"), is a municipal corporation and political subdivision of the State of Indiana and by virtue of I.C. 36-7-11.9 and I.C. 36-7-12 (collectively, the "Act"), is authorized and empowered to adopt this ordinance (this "Bond Ordinance") and to carry out its provisions;

WHEREAS, MCC Properties #100, LLC, or an affiliate thereof (the "Company"), desires to finance the design and construction of certain public improvements described in Exhibit A hereto which are located in or directly serve and benefit the 70/39 Commerce Park Economic Development Area (collectively, the "Projects");

WHEREAS, the Company will complete the Projects for use in connection with its mixed use development in or directly serving and benefiting the 70/39 Commerce Park Allocation Area (the "Facilities");

WHEREAS, the Company has advised the Hendricks County Economic Development Commission (the "Commission") and the County that it proposes that the County issue its Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2019 (Hendricks Gateway Park Project) in an amount not to exceed Seven Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$7,800,000) (the "Bonds"), under the Act and provide the proceeds of such Bonds to the Company for the purpose of financing the Projects;

WHEREAS, the completion of the Projects results in the diversification of industry, the creation of new jobs and the creation of business opportunities in the County;

WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. § 36-7-12-24, the Commission published notice of a public hearing (the "Public Hearing") on the proposed issuance of the Bonds to finance the Projects;

WHEREAS, on the date specified in the notice of the Public Hearing, the Commission held the Public Hearing on the Projects;

WHEREAS, the Commission has performed all actions required of it by the Act preliminary to the adoption of this Bond Ordinance and has approved and forwarded to the Hendricks County Council (the "Council") the forms of: (1) a Financing Agreement between the County and the Company (the "Financing Agreement"); (2) a Trust Indenture between the

County and a trustee to be selected by the Auditor of the County (the "Trustee") (the "Indenture"); (3) the Bonds; and (4) this Bond Ordinance (the Financing Agreement, the Indenture, the Bonds, and this Bond Ordinance, collectively, the "Financing Agreements"); and

WHEREAS, the County desires to contribute \$1,000,000 from its economic development local income tax distribution ("EDIT Funds") to fund infrastructure improvements that will support the Projects (the "Supporting Projects"), in exchange for the agreement of the Hendricks County Redevelopment Commission (the "Redevelopment Commission") to reimburse the County in accordance with the terms of the Reimbursement Agreement presented to this meeting (the "Reimbursement Agreement");

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE HENDRICKS COUNTY COUNCIL, THAT:

Section 1. Findings; Public Benefits. The Council hereby finds and determines that the Projects involve the acquisition, construction and equipping of an "economic development facility" as that phrase is used in the Act; that the Projects will increase employment opportunities and increase diversification of economic development in the County, will improve and promote the economic stability, development and welfare in the County, will encourage and promote the expansion of industry, trade and commerce in the County and the location of other new industries in the County; that the public benefits to be accomplished by this Bond Ordinance, in tending to overcome insufficient employment opportunities and insufficient diversification of industry, are greater than the cost of public services (as that phrase is used in the Act) which will be required by the Project; and, therefore, that the financing of the Projects by the issue of the Bonds under the Act: (i) will be of benefit to the health and general welfare of the County; and (ii) complies with the Act.

Section 2. Approval of Financing. The proposed financing of the Projects by the issuance of the Bonds under the Act, in the form that such financing was approved by the Hendricks County Economic Development Commission, is hereby approved.

Section 3. Authorization of the Bonds. The issuance of the Bonds, payable solely from revenues and receipts derived from the Financing Agreements, is hereby authorized.

Section 4. Terms of the Bonds. (a) The Bonds, in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed Seven Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$7,800,000), shall (i) be executed at or prior to the closing date by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Board of Commissioners of the County and the Auditor of the County; (ii) be dated as of the date of their delivery; (iii) mature on a date not later than twenty-five (25) years after the date on which the first series of the Bonds is issued; (iv) bear interest at such rates as determined with the purchaser thereof (the "Purchaser"); (v) be issuable in such denominations as set forth in the Financing Agreements; (vi) be issuable only in fully registered form; (vii) be subject to registration on the bond register as provided in the Indenture; (viii) be payable in lawful money of the United States of America; (ix) be payable at an office of the Trustee as provided in the Indenture; (x) be subject to optional

redemption prior to maturity and subject to redemption as otherwise provided in the Financing Agreements; (xi) be issued in one or more series; and (xii) contain such other terms and provisions as may be provided in the Financing Agreements.

- (b) The Bonds and the interest thereon do not and shall never constitute an indebtedness of, or a charge against the general credit or taxing power of, the County, but shall be special and limited obligations of the County, payable solely from revenues and other amounts derived from the Financing Agreements. Forms of the Financing Agreements are before this meeting and are by this reference incorporated in this Bond Ordinance, and the Auditor of the County is hereby directed, in the name and on behalf of the County, to insert them into the minutes of the Council and to keep them on file.
- Section 5. Sale of the Bonds. The Board of Commissioners and the Auditor of the County are hereby authorized and directed, in the name and on behalf of the County, to sell the Bonds to the Purchaser at such prices as are determined on the date of sale and approved by the Board of Commissioners and the Auditor of the County.
- Section 6. Execution and Delivery of Financing Agreements. The Board of Commissioners and the Auditor of the County are hereby authorized and directed, in the name and on behalf of the County, to execute or endorse and deliver the Financing Agreement, the Indenture, and the Bonds, submitted to the Common Council, which are hereby approved in all respects.
- Section 7. Changes in Financing Agreements. The Board of Commissioners and the Auditor of the County are hereby authorized, in the name and on behalf of the County, without further approval of the Council or the Commission, to approve such changes in the Financing Agreements as may be permitted by Act, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by their execution thereof.
- Section 8. Reimbursement Agreement. The County Council hereby authorizes the expenditure of up to \$1,000,000 from County EDIT Funds to fund the Supporting Projects, on the condition that the County and the Redevelopment Commission enter into the Reimbursement Agreement substantially in the form presented to this meeting. The Board of Commissioners of the County are hereby authorized to finalize and execute the Reimbursement Agreement on behalf of the County.
- Section 9. General. The Board of Commissioners and the Auditor of the County, and each of them, are hereby authorized and directed, in the name and on behalf of the County, to execute or endorse any and all agreements, documents and instruments, perform any and all acts, approve any and all matters, and do any and all other things deemed by them, or either of them, to be necessary or desirable in order to carry out and comply with the intent, conditions and purposes of this Bond Ordinance (including the preambles hereto and the documents mentioned herein), the Projects, the issuance and sale of the Bonds, the securing of the Bonds under the Financing Agreements, and the transactions contemplated by the Reimbursement Agreement, and any such execution, endorsement, performance or doing of other things heretofore effected be, and hereby is, ratified and approved.

- Section 10. Binding Effect. The provisions of this Bond Ordinance and the Financing Agreements shall constitute a binding contract between the County and the holders of the Bonds, and after issuance of the Bonds this Bond Ordinance shall not be repealed or amended in any respect which would adversely affect the rights of the holders of the Bonds as long as the Bonds or interest thereon remains unpaid.
- Section 11. Repeal. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, including without limitation Ordinance No. 2017-11 adopted by the Council on April 4, 2017.
- Section 12. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Bond Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon adoption.
- Section 13. Copies of Financing Agreements on File. Two copies of the Financing Agreements incorporated into this Bond Ordinance were duly filed in the office of the Auditor of the County, and are available for public inspection in accordance with I.C. § 36-1-5-4.

EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION

Whereas, certain extraordinary emergencies have developed since the adoption of the existing budget, so that it is necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget; therefore, to meet such extraordinary emergencies;

Be it resolved by the County Council of Hendricks County, Indiana, that for the expense of said County the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart out of the several funds as herein and for the purpose herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same.

Nancy,

The terms of my compensatory contract with the county require that I send you an "accounting of expenditures for feeding prisoners on the first Monday of January and the first Monday of July each year."

This language is taken from the Indiana statute regulating the salary contracts of county Sheriffs. (36-2-13-2.5)

I have listed the expenditures and meal counts for our facility as provided to me by Aramark, our food service provider. The numbers cover the period from <u>July 2018 to December 2018</u>.

We transitioned away from the sack lunches and began sending the regular meals to the work release to help them better serve some of their population in October.

Meals served to inmates: (includes meals prepared for work release)
