RESOLUTION 2023 - 25

Comes now the Hendricks County Board of Commissioners ("HCBC") and the Hendricks County Council ("HCC"), and having received funds from the Manufacturer's and Distributor's Opioid Settlement, and further desiring to issue grants in furtherance of reducing opioid addiction, finds as follows:

- 1. Hendricks County is scheduled to receive an initial payment of \$3,990,000, as partial payment of an anticipated \$7,040,018.06 total, as its share of the Manufacturer's and Distributor's Opioid Settlement.
- 2. As part of the guidelines for distribution of the grants to counties, there was promulgated a List of Opioid Remediation Uses which applied to some, but not all, grant funds. A copy of the List of Opioid Remediations Uses are attached hereto as Exhibit E.
- 3. In order to fairly distribute those funds, the Hendricks County Opioid Settlement Task Force ("HCOSTF") was created.
- The HCOSTF created and published a Notice seeking applications for awards of the opioid funds.
- The HCOSTF received the applications and conducted interviews of those entities or groups seeking the grants.
- Upon completion of the application review, the HCOSTF made recommendations to the HCBC and the HCC.
- 7. Further, the HCBC and the HCC finds that an accounting of the use of the funds by the grantees is necessary to ensure compliance with Exhibit E, where appropriate, and the statements made by grantees in their application.

The HCBC and the HCC having considered those recommendations, does hereby finds as follows:

- Each grantee shall report on a semi-annual bases the expenditures of the funds, and detailed results of the purpose of the grant,
- 2. and does hereby award grants as follows:
